Room 6

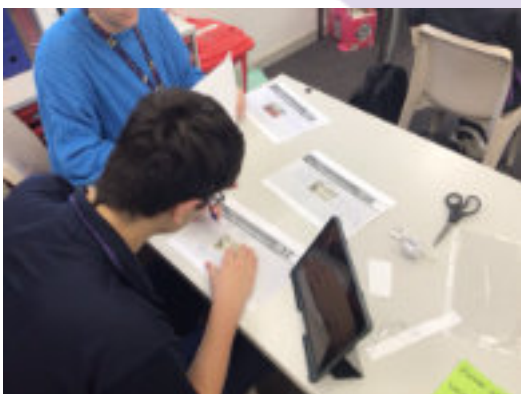

With all these activities, it's been a rewarding and busy term. We're incredibly proud of Room 6 and look forward to more growth next term!

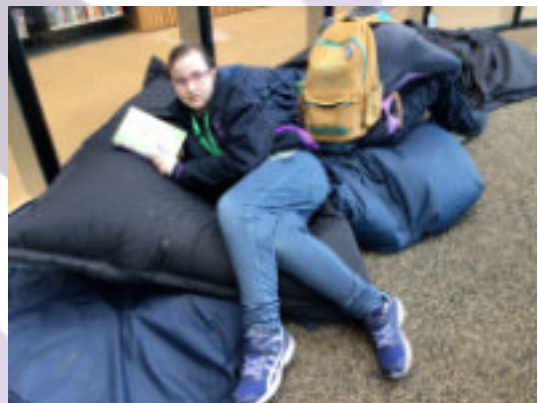


Room 8

Throughout the term, Room 9 has been researching in History, Medieval Europe specifically knights armour, castles, and the beginning of the Black Plague.



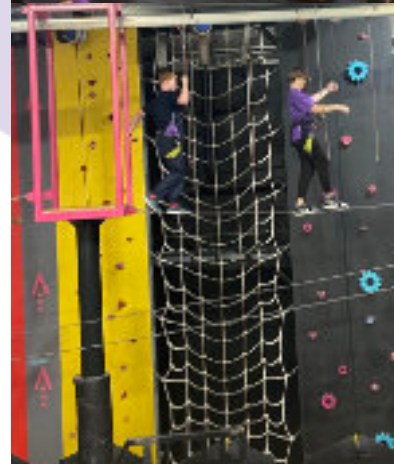
Room 11

Room 15

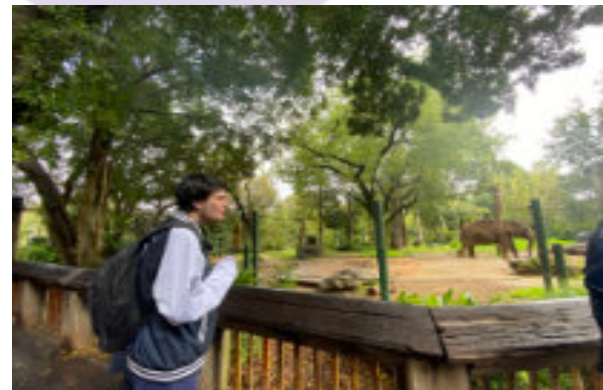
Wow! This term has flown by so quickly, and our students have been incredibly busy with various amazing activities.
